The Sisters living and working in Kuje, Abuja in Nigeria wasted no time in taking every precaution as soon as they heard about the coronavirus pandemic in the country. After that, they followed the directive of the Federal Government of Nigeria that all the educational institutions be shut down until the pandemic is over. The Sisters were more concerned about the health of their students, and as such, they asked all their students to return to their parents.



This difficult time of coronavirus pandemic has affected the community life both positively and negatively. Sisters, including noncommunity members, started maintaining the social distance. As a result of this, some community members who returned from the

United States of America and Lagos experienced self-isolation for few days. Wonders shall never cease! In addition, everybody has been mandated to stay at home and be safe though when there is an urgency to go out (to buy food and other essential items) sisters try to avoid public transportation as much as possible. Adding to this, the Nigeria Province Leadership Team of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, encouraged the sisters to maintain the necessary preventive measures. All domestic staff members were asked to stop work until this period of coronavirus pandemic is over. To follow the update of this pandemic, the sisters created more times to listen to both the local and international news. On the other hand, Sisters try to observe the regular hygiene of washing of hands with soap and water frequently. The use of the hand sanitizer in order to keep the virus away is done regularly. Even though the cost of items has extremely increased, Sisters try to eat more fruits, vegetables and take hot water instead of cold water in order to boost their immune system.
